The Parish Eucharist with Holy Baptism

Welcome to Liverpool Parish Church.

There has been Christian worship on this site since the 13th century and today we are still proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in the centre of Liverpool.

All people are welcome in this place. At the Eucharist if you normally receive Holy Communion in your own church, you are welcome to do so here.

Babies and children are welcome in this church. If you feel they are unsettled, there is more space for stretching legs etc in the Narthex. You would still be able to see, hear and participate in the service, but please rejoin the rest of the congregation when you are ready.

As far as possible whilst distancing guidance remains in force, our **Sunday School** continues to meet. Parents are welcome to stay with their children or to reclaim them at the end of the service. Our **Activity Packs** for children are not available at the moment.

Opening Greeting

The bell rings and we stand, as we are able:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The Celebrant introduces today's service and says the Sunday School prayer.

The Gloria and Collect

We say together:

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Almighty God, you called Luke the physician, whose praise is in the gospel, to be an evangelist and physician of the soul: by the grace of the Spirit and through the wholesome medicine of the gospel, give your Church the same love and power to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Readings (we sit)

First Reading (Isaiah 35.3-6)

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 147, vv. 1-7 is sung by the choir

I Praise the Lord, for it is a good thing to sing praises unto our God *
yea, a joyful and pleasant thing it is to be thankful.

2 The Lord doth build up Jerusalem * and gather together the outcasts of Israel.
3 He healeth those that are broken in heart * and giveth medicine to heal their sickness.
4 He telleth the number of the stars * and calleth them all by their names.
5 Great is our Lord, and great is his power * yea, and his wisdom is infinite.
6 The Lord setteth up the meek * and bringeth the ungodly down to the ground.
7 O sing unto the Lord with thanksgiving * sing praises upon the harp unto our God;

Second reading (2 Timothy 4.5-17)

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

(We stand as the Deacon says the Alleluia)

Alleluia, Alleluia. Lord, we love the house of your habitation and the place where your glory abides. **Alleluia.**

Please face the Gospel reading (Luke 10.1-9)

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke
Glory to you, O Lord

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

The Liturgy of Baptism

The whole congregation is asked:

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome Marianne and uphold her in her new life in Christ? **With the help of God, we will.**

The parents and godparents then stand, and are asked:

Parents and godparents, the Church receives Marianne with joy. Today we are trusting God for her growth in faith. Will you pray for her, guide her by your example into the community of faith and walk with her in the way of Christ? **With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism Marianne begins her journey in faith. You speak for her today. Will you care for her, and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church? **With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? **I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? **I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? **I come to Christ.**

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the child's forehead, saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

The prayer over the water begins with these responses:

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

... be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Marianne Christina Gentile, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.**

The Intercessions (please kneel or sit)

Either of the following responses may be used:

Lord hear us **Lord graciously hear us**

Lord in your mercy **hear our prayer**

At the end: Merciful Father, accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Peace (We stand)

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: Marianne, by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

We welcome you in the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

Offertory

Please remain seated until the end of the Offertory, at which point please stand as the thurifer censes the congregation

*Locus iste, a Deo factus est, in aestimabile sacramentum, irreprehensibilis est.
Locus iste, a Deo factus est.*

This place was made by God, a priceless sacrament;
it is without reproach.

Words: Gradual, for the annual celebration of a church's dedication.

The Eucharistic Prayer

*A prayer is said over the gifts on the altar, to which we respond **Amen.***

The Lord be with you **and also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The seasonal part of the prayer follows and at the end the choir sings:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy
Glory: Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Blessed is he that cometh in
the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

*We pray for the Holy Spirit to transform us and the gifts, and then the words of
Jesus at the Last Supper are recalled:*

The following acclamation is then used:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

The prayer continues with oblation and intercession, ending:

... we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

The choir sings:

○ Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.
(x2)

○ Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, grant us thy peace.

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

If you normally receive Communion in your own church then you are welcome to do so here, or you may prefer the priest to pray for God's blessing on you. Please indicate if you would rather receive a blessing.

In order to preserve social distancing, communion will not be distributed in one central location but will instead be brought to everyone at their seats. Please remain at your seat throughout this time.

Abide with us, we pray, that, blessed by your royal presence, we may walk with you all the days of our life, and at its end behold you in the glory of the eternal Trinity, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

Giving of a lighted candle

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light.

Marianne, you have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

In the name of Christ. Amen.


