Whether you have lost someone recently or many years ago, please use this service as an opportunity to remember them and pray for them, and to give thanks for the blessings they brought to your life. Readings (we sit)

First Reading: (Wisdom 3.1-9)

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Saint Nicholas' Singers sing verses from Psalm 27:

- I. The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear * the Lord is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid?
- 2. When the wicked, even mine enemies and my foes, came upon me to eat up my flesh * they stumbled and fell.
- 3. Though an host of men were laid against me, yet shall not my heart be afraid \ast and though there rose up war against me, yet will I put my trust in him.
- 4. One thing have I desired of the Lord, which I will require * even that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the fair beauty of the Lord, and to visit his temple.
- 5. For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his tabernacle * yea, in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me, and set me up upon a rock of stone.
- 6. And now shall he lift up mine head * above mine enemies round about me.
- 15. I should utterly have fainted * but that I believe verily to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.
- 16. O tarry thou the Lord's leisure * be strong, and he shall comfort thine heart; and put thou thy trust in the Lord.

Second Reading 'The Bright Field' - R. S. Thomas (1913-2000)

I have seen the sun break through to illuminate a small field for a while, and gone my way and forgotten it. But that was the pearl of great price, the one field that had treasure in it. I realize now that I must give all that I have to possess it. Life is not hurrying on to a receding future, nor hankering after an imagined past. It is the turning aside like Moses to the miracle of the lit bush, to a brightness that seemed as transitory as your youth once, but is the eternity that awaits you.

Commemoration

You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honour and power.

For you have created all things, and by your will they have their being.

You are worthy, O Lamb, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and nation.

You have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God, and they will reign with you on earth.

Names of the faithful departed are read out and you are invited to come forward and light a candle in their memory.

While the names are read, the Saint Nicholas' Singers sing Psalm 23:

- I. Lord is my shepherd * therefore can I lack nothing.
- 2. He shall feed me in a green pasture * and lead me forth beside the waters of comfort.
- 3. He shall convert my soul \ast and bring me forth in the paths of righteousness, for his Name's sake.
- 4. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil * for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff comfort me.
- 5. Thou shalt prepare a table before me against them that trouble me * thou hast anointed my head with oil, and my cup shall be full.
- 6. Surely thy loving-kindness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life * and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Hear us, O merciful Father, as we remember in love those whom we have placed in your hands. Acknowledge, we pray, the sheep of your own fold, lambs of your own flock, sinners of your own redeeming. Enfold them in the arms of your mercy, in the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and in the glorious company of the saints in light. **Amen.**

The Peace (We stand)

The Peace is introduced, followed by:

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

The Eucharistic Prayer

A prayer is said over the gifts on the altar, to which we respond **Amen.**

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The seasonal part of the prayer follows and at the end the Saint Nicholas' Singers sing:

Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus, Dominus Deus Sabaoth. Pleni sunt coeli et terra gloria tua. Osanna in excelsis.

[Holy, holy, holy Lord God of Hosts. Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Hosanna in the highest.]

[Requiem Opus 48 - Gabriel Fauré (1848-1924)]

We pray for the Holy Spirit to transform us and the gifts, and then the words of Jesus at the Last Supper are recalled:

The following acclamation is then used: Praise to you, Lord Jesus:

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

The prayer continues with oblation and intercession, ending:
... all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.

Uniting our prayers with the whole company of heaven, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Jesus is the living bread which came down from heaven: if anyone eats of this bread, they will live for ever.

Lord, give us this bread always.

The Saint Nicholas' Singers sing:
Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, dona eis requiem.

[Lamb of God, who takest away the sins of the world, grant them rest.]

You have opened to us the Scriptures, O Christ, and you have made yourself known in the breaking of the bread. Abide with us, we pray, that, blessed by your royal presence, we may walk with you all the days of our life, and at its end behold you in the glory of the eternal Trinity, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

[May the angels lead you into paradise; may the martyrs receive you and lead you to the holy city Jerusalem.]
